



Borough Manager's Report

June 2, 2022

- The Comprehensive Recreation Parks & Open Space (CRPOS) Study Committee continues to meet on the 3rd Tuesday of each month using the Zoom platform. Also, a site visit has been scheduled with a forester and DCNR officials for a walk-through at Negley Park on June 23rd. PASHEK-MTR handles all meeting logistics, and all meetings are open to the public.
- Members of the Community Development/Parks & Recreation Committee and I visited a sculptor in Shippensburg who is considering donating a large piece of artwork to the Borough. Our costs would include surface finishing the piece, transporting it to the site, and installing it. We estimate at least a year to accomplish this which allows time for fundraising. Further discussion on this proposal will be during Committee meetings which are held on the 2nd Thursday of each month at 6:00 p.m.
- The Council President and I attended a municipal breakfast update at the Frederickson Library on May 5th to explore ways the Library can work more closely with its member municipalities to improve marketing efforts. Individual meetings with members will be scheduled to explore this further.
- The floor replacement project at the Borough Offices is complete. We invite everyone to stop by to see what a great improvement this is to the facility at 510 Herman Avenue.
