## Arbor Day Foundation Names Lemoyne Tree City USA Lemoyne Celebrates with Arbor Day Festival

**Lemoyne, Pennsylvania April, 26 2024**- Lemoyne, PA was awarded a Tree City USA designation by the Arbor Day Foundation in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management.

Lemoyne will celebrate the honor on Saturday, April 27, 2024 with an Arbor Day Festival from 10:00 am – 2:00 p.m. at Memorial Park, located at 50 Hummel Ave in Lemoyne. This rain or shine watershed education event is free and open to the public, with all activities being held under tents and pavilions. Lemoyne's inaugural Arbor Day Festival in 2023 brought in over 500 residents and visitors.

Lemoyne Borough partnered with its Shade Tree Commission and the Conodoguinet Creek Watershed Association, along with several local, state, and national organizations to host this watershed education event. Participants will learn how to make changes at home to improve the health of our watershed and help our birds, pollinator insects, and wildlife by experiencing art stations, craft projects, hands-on STEM activities, giveaways for kids and adults, prizes, a pop-up Story Walk, and more. Used bike donations are welcome and free minor bike repairs will be available onsite.

Learn how to save the endangered Monarch butterflies with Fairhaven Healing, See raptors such as a hawk, owl, vulture, as well as a mammal and a reptile rescued by Red Creek Wildlife Center. Touch live reptiles, amphibians, small mammals, and more with Critter Connections. Stop by Whitaker on Wheels, Fredricksen Library, the Pennsylvania WoodMobile traveling museum, and many other vendors for interactive activities for children and adults. Free trees and seeds will be offered.

The festival will celebrate the incredible efficiency of trees as a natural solution to many community problems and highlight the importance of native trees and plants in providing clean water, mitigating stormwater pollution, reducing erosion, and balancing the ecosystem. Ahead of the Arbor Day celebration, the Lemoyne Maintenance and MS4 Departments planted 29 native Bare Root trees provided by grant funding through TreePennsylvania to help reforest the borough's parks and public spaces.

The Tree City USA program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in partnership with the U.S. Forest Service and the National Association of State Foresters. "Everyone benefits when elected officials, volunteers and committed citizens in communities like City make smart investments in urban forests," said Matt Harris, chief executive of the Arbor Day Foundation. "Trees bring shade to our homes and beauty to our neighborhoods, along with numerous economic, social and environmental benefits."

Trees are assets to a community when properly planted and maintained. They help to improve the visual appeal of a neighborhood, increase property values, reduce home cooling costs, remove air pollutants and provide wildlife habitat, among many other benefits. ## Lemoyne Arbor Day Festival to host Pennsylvania WoodMobile

**Lemoyne, Pennsylvania April, 26 2024** - Take an educational walk in Penn's Woods and learn about Pennsylvania's nation-leading hardwoods industry through the new Pennsylvania WoodMobile, one of the exhibits at the Lemoyne Arbor Day Festival on Saturday, Apr. 27.

An outreach tool of the Pennsylvania Hardwoods Development Council, the WoodMobile is a cooperative effort between government and industry. The WoodMobile educates the public about Pennsylvania's forests and sustainable forest management – securing the wood products we need today while protecting the trees of tomorrow. The mobile exhibit uses interactive activities and displays to promote the responsible use of forest resources and an understanding of the forest industry to the public.

"The WoodMobile promotes sustainable forestry and the green use of wood products," said Jon Geyer, Executive Director of the Hardwoods Development Council. "Pennsylvania and the United States leads the world in sustainable forestry. When you buy locally grown and manufactured wood products, you help the safety of our environment and strengthen our economy."

Pennsylvania is home to the largest hardwoods forest in the United States, providing more than ten percent of the nation's hardwood lumber supply. Pennsylvania's timber industry accounts for more than \$21.8 billion in direct economic impact annually and provides more than 60,000 jobs, the state has more forested acres today than it did 100 years ago due to the sustainability efforts of the industry.

Within the 34-foot long WoodMobile are numerous panels showing the history and industry surrounding Pennsylvania's forests. Interactive exhibits on leaf and wood identification and touch screens providing information about threats to the forest from invasive insects and plants capture viewer's attention, keeping them engaged in learning about Penn's Woods. In the front of the WoodMobile, videos show the transformation of a log from the forest to the furniture in your home.

Visitors to the WoodMobile can test their hardwood knowledge in a game by guessing which of 60+ items do not contain wood. Choices include toothpaste, imitation vanilla, toilet paper, ice cream, aspirin, diet foods, film, and shoe polish. All these items contain wood or wood byproducts.

Operated by the Pennsylvania Hardwoods Development Council in the Department of Agriculture and sponsored by the Pennsylvania Forest Products Association, the WoodMobile travels about 150 days per year from April to November, delivering free, educational programs to elementary and middle school students and members of the public. Since the unveiling, the WoodMobile has exhibited at more than 1,270 events hosting more than two million visitors, including more than 232,000 students who participated in school programs.

- ❖ Bare Root Tree Grant from TreePennsylvania
  - THANK YOU TreePennsylvania, the Pennsylvania Urban and Community Forestry Council!
  - Completed all trainings, submissions, and grantee requirements
  - TreePennsylvania notified Lemoyne Borough that we were selected to receive 30 free trees through the grant!
  - Walked through parks and public sites with Maintenance to reassess and affirm planting sites for all trees
    - Maintenance staff marked and pre-dug holes for incoming plantings
    - One tree missing from nursery order; we received 29 trees.
    - Assisted Maintenance Department with final placement and planting of all trees.
    - Digging most of these holes was quite a challenge ... A HUGE THANK YOU to our entire Maintenance Staff, who were able to dig holes, plant, mulch, stake, and water within just a few days to ensure the health of our newly planted trees.

❖ The beginning of April brought several days of persistent, heavy rains and wind.

Monitored flow of stormwater, inspected, and assessed conditions and performance of storm drains, inlets, outfalls, tributaries, BMPs, and green infrastructure (including newly planted Bare Root Trees)

throughout the month during all weather conditions.





- Street sweeping has begun for the spring season!
  - Street sweeping removes oils, chemicals, and pollutants from our roadways before they reach our storm drains, tributaries, and the Susquehanna River.
  - Street sweeping significantly contributes to Lemoyne Borough's stormwater pollution reduction.
  - Check signs on your street for scheduled street cleaning and parking details.



- Removed trash, leaves, and debris from Rain Gardens and pots.
- ❖ Maintenance staff performed manual heavy duty clean out of sludge, dirt, oil, salt, pollutants, skid stones, and more in our rain garden forebays and bricks.
- ❖ Investigated reports of Illicit Discharge on behalf of DEP; worked with DEP and Borough staff to determine appropriate outcome and next steps.



❖ Maintenance staff cleared storm drain, inlet, and vegetated swale, which restored the flow of stormwater at 5th St & Washington Terrace by raking and shoveling out mud, compacted leaves, and debris.

❖ Maintenance staff cleared storm drain, inlet, and vegetated swale, which restored the flow of stormwater at Woodside Park by raking and shoveling out mud, sludge, compacted leaves, and debris.







\* Rainstorms and wind caused buildup on storm drains throughout month. MS<sub>4</sub> and Maintenance staff removed leaves, debris, and trash from drains throughout month.



- Cumberland County Land Partnerships Grant:
  - Repaving/ resurfacing of basketball court completed along with measuring, marking, taping, and painting of new lines on court.
  - Brackets for basketball equipment have been cleaned, sanded, and resurfaced.
  - New backboards have been purchased for court.
  - New asphalt surface for Gaga Ball foundation installed next to playground equipment.
  - Safety rubber matting for Gaga Pit has been laid and installed.

• ADA accessible Gaga Ball pit assembled, prepared for weather conditions, and built on site.

# 2024 National Stormwater Policy Forum

- Participated in National Stormwater Policy Forum, Washington DC
  - Hosted by the National Municipal Stormwater Alliance (NMSA), Water Environment Foundation (WEF), National Association of Counties (NAC), and National League of Cities (NLC)
  - The need for national stormwater funding and policy change is imminent and overdue
  - Legal definition changes for WOTUS Waters of the United States
  - Implications for Stormwater & Stormwater Control Features
  - Climate change and stormwater impacts
  - Research and technology to address climate and resilience, environmental justice, and transportation
  - Efforts to bridge climate research communities with policy decisions at US DOT, across the Federal government, and spanning local, Tribal, state, and international levels of government
    - Incorporating natural infrastructure in US DOT and across government infrastructure projects
    - Take evidence-informed actions and promote resiliency within communities
    - Stormwater Solutions highlight:
      - Nature-Based Solutions/ Green Infrastructure/ Natural Capital Accounting
    - More appropriately and accurately valuing and accounting for nature-based solutions and resiliency they provide
  - Chesapeake Bay Water Quality Policies PA will not meet 2025 Goals
    - Top causes of water pollution into the Chesapeake Bay are:
      - Agricultural runoff
      - Stormwater runoff
  - Stormwater Best Management Practices
    - Bioretention, green roofs, permeable pavement, rainwater harvesting, Bay-scaping, rain gardens, tree planting
  - MS4 Permit Activities:
    - Pollution prevention (public education & outreach/ good housekeeping)
    - Pollution treatment and removal (stormwater BMPs, source reduction)
  - Need to better understand MS4 Storm Sewer Systems
    - Connected impervious areas
    - Inlets
    - Outlets and channels
    - Enclosed pipes
    - Surface drainage



- Drivers for more resilient stormwater solutions:
  - Reduce overall risk
  - Create affordable solutions
  - Address flash flooding
  - Support more sustainable development/ redevelopment
  - Provide community multiple benefit solutions
  - Integrate green infrastructure
  - Protect and enhance natural systems
  - Meet water quality regulations
- Stormwater pollution program focus:
  - Resources to connect Federal funding to multi benefits of green infrastructure and stormwater management
  - Align funding for nature-based solutions and green infrastructure with FEMA programs & EPA
  - Technical assistance for green infrastructure stormwater management
  - Long term stormwater integrated planning formerly focused on Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) systems / now focusing on MS4 (Municipal Separate Stormwater Systems) systems and parks projects – combine efforts to integrate water into projects
  - Tools around asset management and funding
  - Incorporating green infrastructure into roadway projects
  - Emerging contaminants wastewater & stormwater exposure causes human health and environmental risks
    - PFAS / PFOS long lasting, widely used toxic chemicals found in air, water, soil, fish, etc., in everyday products and often from manufacturing, industrial, and waste facilities
    - 6-PPD/ 6-PPD-quinone toxic chemicals released into air & water release from tires & roadways
    - After identifying need to regulate contaminants, we must determine how to permit and effectively manage these and potentially other pollutants
- Managing stormwater closer to the sources
  - Flood prevention practices = community resilience + water quality improvements
  - Integrated resiliency planning, design solutions, & implementation
  - Many communities currently having stormwater issues in urban areas
    - Not just 100-year storm events causing flooding
    - Intensity and volume of rain is causing flooding for 1-year or 2-year rain events
  - Green infrastructure integrated benefits, green streets, reduction in costs, increase in multi-level benefits



- Right sized solutions and adaptability
- More Federal level support of stormwater programs is needed
- Recommendation to request chemical manufacturers assess the potential for chemical to be released into the environment and potential impacts as a pollutant on the water prior to allowing approval and finding out years/ decades later
- National MS4 Community 2024 requests to the Federal Government:
  - 1. Advance stormwater provisions in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act
  - 2. Support stormwater infrastructure funding tools
  - 3. Federal support for increased Community Resilience Planning and Implementation
  - 4. Support an Emerging Contaminants Program for stormwater pollution



- Earned Environmentally Sensitive Maintenance Certification
  - Program provides knowledge and tools to implement cost-efficient, environmentally sensitive road
    maintenance practices, including more efficient ways to fix drainage problems, reduce sediment
    pollution, and improve our local water quality.
  - Project focus includes: installation of additional cross pipes/replacement of failing cross pipes, installation of subsurface drainage features like underdrain trenches, French Mattresses, and infiltration areas (underground or rain gardens), stream culvert replacements, stream bank stabilization, and road bank stabilization.
  - Training provided by Penn State Center for Dirt & Gravel Road Studies, DCNR, and the PA State Conservation Commission.
  - Course certification is required for eligibility to apply for Low Volume Road Grant funds. Earning this certification allows Lemoyne Borough to submit eligible projects for grant funding.
- Participated in Watershed Training hosted by Cumberland County and Penn State Extension
  - Workshop supported by the PA DEP Environmental Education Program
  - Training is specifically geared to teaching about stormwater runoff and pollution



- ❖ Participated in BioBlitz 2024 at the Vince DiFilippo Nature Preserve
  - Watershed educational event for select West Shore School District and Cumberland Valley middle
    and high school students hosted by the Chesapeake Bay Foundation and the Conodoguinet Creek
    Watershed Association.
  - Stations included: water quality monitoring, macroinvertebrate capture and count, native vs invasive plant species identification, Conodoguinet Creek fish capture and count, riparian buffer tree management and maintenance practices, and reptiles and herpetology.
  - Students were able to identify and count reptile, aquatic insects, amphibians, and fish species on site and documented study results.
  - Experts from multiple organizations guided students through each hands-on station and taught scientific method and environmental stewardship practices.
  - CBF uploaded biological findings to iNaturalist.
  - Will count as a collaboration with multiple municipalities, watershed organizations, and government offices as a community engagement & education event on our annual DEP report.
