Streets and Storm Water Committee

Minutes of the Meeting Held on April 13, 2015 at 5:00PM

1. Call to Order

A meeting of the Streets and Storm Water Committee of the Lemoyne Borough Council was held on Monday, April 13, 2015 at the Lemoyne Borough Hall, 510 Herman Avenue, Lemoyne, PA. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Dennis McGee.

2. Roll Call

Present at roll call was David Beasley. Brenda Candioto was absent. Staff members present were Robert Ihelin, Borough Manager, James Fair, Maintenance Supervisor, Michael Knouse, Borough Engineer, and Karen Unger, Executive Assistant.

3. Public Comments

Kathleen Garrett and Bill Nemitz from Attorney General's office on Susquehanna Court have expressed concerns from building employees about leaving the office and getting on to Lowther Street. There have been four near misses since February 2015. A number of improvements for the highway signage and markings were discussed. Another option would be the opening of the end of Walton Street. However residents of Walton Street have expressed opposition to this idea. The Committee asked staff to send a letter to the property owner inquiring they would be interested in dedicating the land to the Borough.

Residents Floyd Focht and Eric Lauerman from the Camp Hill Borough expressed concerns about flooding between 15th and 16th Streets (Shaffer Alley). They had heard that Lemoyne Borough was doing a storm water management study and wanted to see if that area was going to be included. Mr. Knouse responded that it was a little bit outside the study area.

4. Review of the minutes of the previous meeting

Mr. Beasley made a motion to approve the minutes as amended. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved.

Mr. Knouse presented a paving project for Tenth Street from Hummel Avenue to the match line near Ayers Avenue. Cost for the project is \$135,000. Engineering costs are \$8000 to \$9000. There is \$300,000 available in the Liquid Fuels balance. The Committee decided to move this project to Council for approval.

A. Mr. Knouse reported that a permit is needed to disturb the wetlands at Woodside Park. This could take three to four months.
