Streets and Stormwater Committee

Minutes of the Meeting held on May 12, 2014

1. Call to Order
A meeting of the Streets and Stormwater Committee of the Lemoyne Borough Council was held on Monday May 12, 2014 at Lemoyne Borough Hall, 510 Herman Avenue, Lemoyne, PA. Chairman Dennis McGee called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.
2. Roll Call
Committee members David Beasley and Brenda Candioto were present. Stacy Gromlich and Suzanne Yenchko of Borough Council were also present. Staff present were John Paden, Robert Ihlein, and Borough Engineer Phillip Brath.
3. Public Comments
Ms. Gromlich commented on an email that was sent to Mayor York regarding high curbs at the intersection of State Street and Market Street. Mr. Ihlein reported that the curbs there have the normal 8 inch reveal.
4. Review the Minutes from Previous Meeting
The minutes of the April meeting had not been completed. Committee members are to check their notes and see if they can be completed for review at the next meeting.

STREETS

5. *Unfinished Business*

- a) Market Street improvements
Mr. Ihlein reported that the new pedestrian street lights and not been activated. Some minor changes in the location of the flashing beacons on Market Street had to be approved by PennDOT. There still seems to be an issue with PPL on the type of electric meter cabinet. The contractor can move forward as soon as approval was received.
- b) Phase I crosswalks
Mr. Ihlein reported that a meeting of the parties involved scheduled in the near future.
- c) Request for stop sign at 12th St. and Lemoyne Drive
Mr. Ihlein reported there has been no action on this issue and asked that it be taken off the agenda. The Committee agreed.
- d) Salt brine tank and application system
Mr. Paden reported that he has been in touch with Lower Allen Township to get more information about purchasing the salt brine and the equipment they use to apply it.

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e) Walton Street Project

Mr. Brath reported that the water company has ordered parts and is waiting for them to be delivered. However, he does not expect them to begin until next month.

f) Recommendation to review existing storm water management ordinances for possible updates

Mr. McGee recommended having this item referred to the Ordinance and Zoning Committee.

g) Speed enforcement tape

Mr. Paden reported the vinyl tape is now in stock and he is looking to have the maintenance staff working on this during the week of May 27, weather permitting.

h) Electronics Trash – Will be moved to Environmental Advisory Council for further action

It was suggested that the members of the new EAC be invited to this committee meeting once the members are appointed by Council.

i) Eye on Crime signs

So far three residents have expressed their desire to purchase signs for their neighborhoods. Mr. Paden reported that the cost of a new sign with the post is \$75.

j) ADA Ramps on Herman Avenue

Mr. Ihlein reported that he will file the paperwork with the county to get final grant approval for this project.

6. New Business

a) On-Call Engineering Services

Mr. McGee asked the Committee to set a date and time to interview two candidates for the position of Borough Engineer. The Committee chose May 29th. The firm of Rettew Associates would be scheduled at 6:00 PM, and the firm of ARRO Consultants will be scheduled at 6:30 PM.

b) Snow emergency routes

Updating the borough ordinance concerning snow emergencies has been referred to the Ordinance and Zoning Committee.

STORM WATER

7. Unfinished Business

a) *Requirements under MS-4 permit

Mr. McGee inquired about gaining access to the railroad to inspect stormwater outfalls.

Mr. Ihlein will work on getting permission from the railroad to enter their property.

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b) *Maple & Walton Sts. Storm drain project

Mr. Brath reported that he hopes to get the water company on the job in a few weeks. They need to put their new pipes in before the borough contractor starts on the stormwater pipes.

c) *Chesapeake Bay Pollutant Reduction Plan

Mr. Brath reported he is working on this. The deadline to submit it is in June.

d) **Storm water issues along Norfolk Southern Railroad (Shippensburg Spur) near 10th Street (West Shore Plaza shops) on State Street between Market & State Streets
(Priority #3)

This item was not discussed.

e) Possible solution to the overflow of the Ayers Pond–Verbal offer by JVH Excavating Co
Mr. Ihlein reported that Council should take formal action at a public meeting to instruct the Solicitor to move forward with obtaining a drainage easement for the new storm water inlets and pipes. The Committee agreed to put this on the Council meeting agenda.

f) *Storm water improvements on Herman Avenue (LMA/PENNDOT) sewer project
(Wexcon)

Mr. Ihlein reported that the contractor for the sanitary sewer project is now working to put a new pipe under 3rd Street. It will take a couple more months before they move up the street to where the new storm water inlets and pipes are to be installed.

g) **Recommendation to review existing storm water management ordinances for possible updates

This item has been referred to the Ordinance and Zoning Committee.
